Quick answers to common questions:

Why become a home care worker in Oregon?

- Are you looking for your first job, a new career or want a flexible schedule? Working
 in home care might be right for you. It offers meaningful work, good benefits and free
 training to get started and grow your skills.
- Home care makes a difference in someone's life, and it gives you the flexibility you need to live yours.
- The need for more home care is growing fast in Oregon. There are many jobs available.
- One study found that by 2030, Oregon will need to fill 36,000 job openings in home care to meet the state's demands.

About these roles

- There are four kinds of home care jobs that support people who receive state services. People can work in one or more roles.
 - Homecare Workers: Support older adults and people with physical disabilities.
 Help with daily tasks, personal care and mobility to help people live more independently.
 - Personal Care Attendants: Support people with behavioral or mental health needs. Assist with daily living activities, medication reminders and coping strategies.
 - Personal Support Workers: Support children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). Help with daily living, personal care and life skills at home and in their community.
 - Personal Support Worker Job Coaches: Support people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) to get, learn and keep the jobs of their choice in the workplace. Provide on-the-job coaching, training and accommodations.
 They help individuals build confidence and stay employed.
